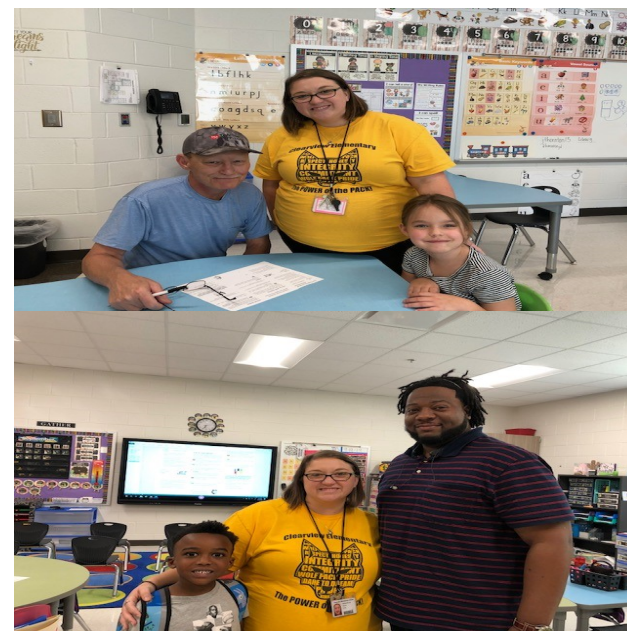

The 1st Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:



Teachers will send home library books and have students access Razkids at home to reinforce reading.



Send home weekly math homework pages in a daily homework folder.



Provide parents with Foundation unit resources and math facts flash cards.

At Home

CVES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success



Parents will make sure that students are reading every night.



Parents will help students complete math homework at home.



Parents will make flash-cards for students to practice at home.



1st Grade Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:



Bring home library book and access Razkids at home to reinforce reading.



Ask my family for help with daily homework sheets.



Practice math facts and building words from the letter Foundation tiles.



Teachers, Parents, and Students believe these additional key points will create success for our 1st Graders this year:

1. Be respectful. Listen to parents and teachers.
2. Be responsible. Bring homework to and from school.
3. Read and write daily.
4. Get enough sleep at night.
