Teachers, Parents, Students- Working Together for Success

In the 2nd Grade Classroom

The 2nd Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:



We will give the students 15-20 minutes daily guided/independent reading time in a small group setting.



We will give the students 15-20 minutes of independent reading time on the program RAZ Kids.



We will give students time to build math fluency using the program Reflex.

At Home

CVES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success in Reading and Math.



Parents will spend at least 30 minutes with our child studying reading and math together at home.



Parents will read with our child every night and complete the reading log daily.



Parents will review math skills by going over the example sheet at home.



2nd Grade Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:



We will read our library book each night, and take an AR test.



We will try our best on the RAZ kids program, and on our AR test.



We will study our math facts at home.



Teachers, Parents, and Students believe these additional key points will create success for our 2nd Graders this year:

- **Bring our Tuesday folders home each week, and make sure a parent signs it. Bring it back to school on Wednesday with any important notes.**
- **Read and complete homework every night. Turn it in on time.**
- **Share learning apps with both home and school to increase learning.**
