At Home CVES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success

Parents will read the newsletter to assist their students.



Parents will work with students nightly for 5 minutes by using flash cards to master multiplication facts (0-12).



Parents and students will read together nightly for a minimum of 15 minutes.
